LIVING HIS STORY – Hannah Steele

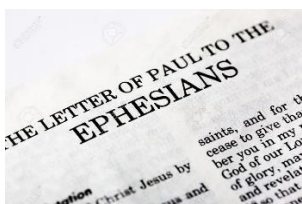


How can we convey the love of God to our neighbours in a post-Christian world that has largely forgotten the gospel of Jesus Christ?

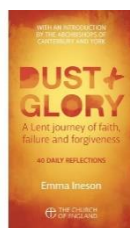
EPHESIANS

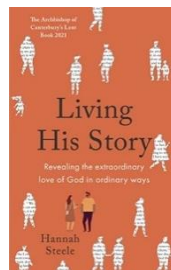

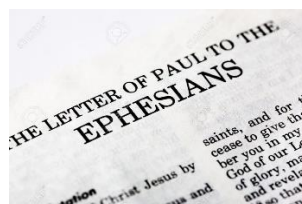
