The King's Award for Voluntary Service


The Thomas Poole Library, Nether Stowey is proud to have been nominated for the prestigious King's Award for Voluntary Service 2025.

Nicks Gardening Notes July and August 2025

With July and August we start to see what our hard work has produced. The flower borders are colourful, and we should be enjoying good quality home grown vegetables and soft fruit. However, writing this in mid-June we have experienced an unusual spring with long dry periods and water butts running dry. Do remember that when watering it is better to give plants a generous amount rather than too little which encourages shallow rooting. Drying winds have been numerous, and they can easily break extension growth such as new shoots on roses. Get them tied in!

Vegetables: Often July and August weather can be quite damp, and a watchful eye should be kept on potatoes and tomatoes for any sign of potato blight. Foliage affected with brown/black markings should be removed and burnt rather than put onto the compost heap. As you use early crops, clear the ground so that it can be prepared for a succession crop. Carrots, lettuce and salad leaves, spring cabbage, turnips and oriental leaves together with mangetout peas can still be sown to maintain a succession of vegetables. Ensure that brassicas already planted are protected from cabbage white butterfly by using small mesh netting supported above the crop and not resting on the foliage. It is important to be sensible and not waste water. Priority should be given to crops such as courgettes and squash, peas which are responsive to extra moisture at the flowering and pod swelling stage, potatoes when the new tubers are marble size and runner and French beans ensuring the roots do not become stressed. Keep root crops moist to avoid stop/start growth resulting in tough and tasteless vegetables. As always weeds have continued to thrive and regular hoeing between crops minimises weeds competing for water and nutrients.

The greenhouse: Ensure that tomatoes and cucumbers are regularly fed, watered, trimmed and trained. At this stage feed should be applied weekly with a proprietary tomato feed which favours the nutrient potassium, essential for good flower and fruit formation. This is also suitable for cucumbers, peppers, chillis and aubergines.

Fruit: Once strawberries have finished fruiting it is an opportunity to rejuvenate the crop. Old straw should be raked out and composted and the foliage cut down to about 2 to 3 inches (50-75mm) and any weed removed. Apply a general fertiliser and water in, or liquid feed, and in no time quality new foliage will appear. This all helps to remove pests and diseases. Strawberries are not long-lived plants and quality declines after four to five years. Runners provide an opportunity to propagate new plants but only take them from strong healthy plants. Excess runners can be removed.

New growth on cordon, espalier and fan trained apples and pears should be summer pruned to restrict size and build up fruit bud for next year. Thin heavy crops of apples, pears and plums to increase fruit size. Branches can be susceptible to breakage if the crop is too heavy and a prop to support the branch can be useful.

Ornamentals: Wisteria should be pruned, and the new whippy growth cut back to a bud at about 6 inches (150mm). This will encourage the build-up of flower bud for the following year. Keep regularly deadheading blooms for continuity of flower and with some such as lupins, poppies and delphiniums they

can be cut back hard down to the basal cluster of leaves to produce new growth and some late flower. Bearded iris that have flowered can be lifted and old rhizomes cut out and young vibrant sections replanted with their foliage cut down by half. Apply a fertiliser dressing or well-rotted manure and water well in. This will ensure good bloom next year.

Wall trained shrubs such as Pyracantha and Chaenomeles (Japonica or Japanese quince) can be summer pruned in a similar way to fruit. Roses have been really excellent this year and old blooms should be dead headed.

During August many shrubs can be propagated by semi-ripe cuttings – more plants for free!







The Annual Parish Meeting (APM) and Annual Meeting of the Parish Council (AMPC) were both held on the 28th May 2025. At the AMPC, Cllr Tully was re-elected as the Chair and has stated that this will be his last year in the position. Cllr Barrow stepped down as the Vice-Chair and Cllr Lindley accepted the nomination made for the role and was duly elected.

Cllr Lindley also requested that the refurbishment of the Fingerpost Signs, completed last year, be highlighted as a successful project. The following outlines the journey from initial concern to completed restoration:

This began when a local resident raised concerns about the deteriorating state of several fingerposts across the parish in January 2024.

These distinctive signs, part of the rural charm and a valued piece of local heritage, are not only important for wayfinding but also contribute to the character of our village for both residents and visiting holidaymakers.

Recognising their cultural and historical value, the matter was brought before the Parish Council, where councillors unanimously agreed that action was needed. The Council resolved to explore options for restoring these iconic signs and to seek financial support to ensure the work could be carried out to a high standard. We are extremely grateful to the Quantock Landscape Partnership Scheme for awarding the necessary grant funding of 75% of the total cost of the work that made this project possible. Their support enabled us to proceed with the careful refurbishment of the fingerposts, preserving their traditional design while ensuring their long-term durability.

The grant application process was straightforward and the works

were completed before the end of 2024. The restored fingerposts stand proudly once again, offering both practical guidance and a beautiful nod to our local history.

Their transformation has already drawn compliments from residents. This successful project demonstrates how a single voice in the community, supported by the Parish Council and funding partners, can lead to meaningful and lasting improvements.

Our thanks go to the resident who first brought the issue to our attention, to the councillors who all supported the initiative and also to our funding partner for making this restoration possible.

Hinkley Point C Ready for Dome Lift

This summer, Hinkley Point C is hitting major milestones that show just how far the project has come and how much faster and smarter we're now building.

Prefabrication now accounts for nearly 60% of civil construction, turning Hinkley Point C into what's effectively a "Large Modular Reactor."

More work is happening off-site, leading to faster assembly and big productivity gains - including recent mega-lifts like a 170-tonne staircase and entire rooms installed in one piece.



The results are clear: Unit 2 is being built significantly faster than Unit 1. At dome lift, it will be 40% further ahead with fewer people on site.

Structural steel installation has jumped from 10 to nearly 300 tonnes, and assembling the polar crane is 40% quicker.

These improvements don't just benefit Hinkley Point C - they pave the way for future projects like Sizewell C to be more efficient from day one.

Supporting inclusive social events for adults with learning disabilities

An inspiring initiative breaking down barriers for adults with learning disabilities has received £10,000 from Hinkley Point C Community Fund.

Since receiving funding, Loveable CIC has launched monthly social events in Bridgwater, beginning at Allstars Sports Bowl and now continuing at the Admirals Landing pub.

In just 2 months, the project has connected 25 local people with learning disabilities, helping to reduce loneliness and isolation.

Research by Mencap shows that 82% of people with learning disabilities experience loneliness, with more than 1 in 10 leaving their homes just once a week or less. "We're not interested in creating separate spaces that further marginalise people with learning disabilities," said Anoushka Cross, CEO and Founder of Loveable CIC.

July 2025

Am writing this on a rainy June afternoon, finding it a bit challenging to write a summer recipe to be frank. A glass of rose and a day of sunshine has helped. So here are some great ideas for a summer lunch.

I first tasted the broad bean and prawn salad (salade de fèves et crevettes) in the medieval French town of Carcassonne. Podding the fresh broad beans is a little fiddly but definitely worth it. Eat on its own as a light lunch with crusty bread or as a starter.

Broad bean and prawn salad

Ingredients – serves 4
Fresh broad beans (Approx 1.6kg gross / 575g net)
100g Pancetta cut into cubes (lardons will do)
20 raw, frozen and peeled prawns
60ml Olive oil
Pinch dried chilli flakes (optional)
Squeeze of lemon juice

Method

Podding the broad beans is done in 2 stages. First remove the beans from the outer pod.

Then in a large saucepan, half fill with salted water, bring to the boil, tip in the podded beans and blanche for a minute and a half.

Remove with a slotted spoon and place into a bowl of cold water to stop them over cooking.

You will notice that the beans have a "root end". Take that between thumb and forefinger and pinch off a section of the pale skin and squeeze the bright green pod out. It's a knack but an easy one to master.

In a heavy bottomed frying pan, add a glug (60ml) of olive oil. Allow the oil to heat up for about a minute, add the pancetta or lardons and colour to a gentle golden.

Now add the double podded broad beans, toss through for a couple of minutes, add the prawns (and chilli flakes if you are adding). The prawns are cooked when they turn pink.

Divide into small bowls, add a squeeze of lemon and a pinch of salt.

In the 1950s the revered English food writer Elizabeth David, along with Constance Spry and Fanny Craddock brought many Mediterranean influenced dishes to the UK when generally you could only buy olive oil at the chemist! This is a recipe I discovered in one of my many Elizabeth David books called Italian food. It's a great quick lunch served with a green salad.

Piedmonte peppers - Serves 4

Ingredients

- 4 red peppers
- 4 anchovies in oil (rinsed under cold water)
- 2 garlic cloves sliced
- 1 fresh tomato, diced with seeds removed 60ml olive oil

Method

Cut the peppers in half length ways to create a small boat like shape. Take out all the seeds. If they are quite large, cut in half again.

Into each piece, place 2 slices of garlic, 2 slices of tomato and an anchovy cut in small pieces, a small knob of butter.

Place on a baking sheet and drizzle lightly with olive oil. Place in a pre-heated oven at 160 degrees C for about 20 mins. Serve with warm crusty bread.

A summer frittata – Serves 2

Another fabulous Italian light lunch or early summer supper. Any soft herb will work with this.

For the vegetables I have used the last of this season's asparagus, some young broccoli and some precooked potato that I had to hand.

There are no rules! You could use tomatoes, courgettes. You could also grate in Parmesan or pecorino.

Ingredients

Asparagus, trimmed and cut into small sections

One small clove of garlic finely chopped

One shallot finely sliced

6 eggs beaten and seasoned with salt and pepper

60 ml Olive oil

New potatoes cooked and cooled

Soft herbs roughly chopped (Parsley, Basil, Dill, Oregano)

Method

In an oven proof non-stick pan add olive oil on a medium heat. Add the potatoes along with the asparagus and stir fry for about 2 minutes. Now add the shallot and the garlic. Cook again for 2 minutes.

Now add whatever herbs you are using (a good handful of each)

Now pour in the beaten egg. Stir in all the herbs and vegetables. When everything is semi set, finish in a pre-heated oven at 160 degrees C for 6-7 minutes.

Serve with a crisp green salad

Enjoy!
